Why are we switching from Skype for Business to Microsoft Teams?

Microsoft announced that Skype for Business will be retiring on 31 July 2021. To prepare for this change, we are transitioning from Skype for Business to Microsoft Teams.

When is the change from Skype for Business to Microsoft Teams happening?


The shift from Skype for Business to Teams has already begun for some trainers and will be finalised by the end of Skype for Business's life cycle (31 July 2021).

What about learners that I currently contact via Skype, Skype for Business, or phone?


You can continue to contact your current learners using their preferred platform, but please be aware that new learners may have Microsoft Teams listed as their favourite contact method. Also, if you have a learner who has Skype for Business as their preferred contact method and they have sessions beyond 31 July 2021, you will have to agree on a different communication method once Skype for Business is retired.

Can I still make direct phone calls in Microsoft Teams?


You can make a phone call by selecting the **Calls** tab and clicking or typing the number on the dial pad on the bottom left of the screen:




If the person is already in your contact list, select the **Calls** tab:



Then Contacts:




Search for or scroll to the person's name, then click on the **Call** icon:




Can I contact a learner who uses Skype or Skype for Business from Microsoft Teams?

You can make calls or send messages to learners who use Skype or Skype for Business from Microsoft Teams if you know the email address associated with their account.

To start, enter the learner's email address in the search box at the top of the Microsoft Teams window and select **Search <email address> externally**:



The name of your learner on Skype for Business or Skype will appear along with their Skype ID in place of the **Search <email address> externally** option. Click on their name to open the chat window:



There are some limitations when using Microsoft Teams to contact a learner on Skype for Business or Skype:


- » Conversations are text-only. You can't use rich formatting, @mentions, emojis, or any other chat features available for Microsoft Teams to Microsoft Teams chats.
- » Conversations are one-to-one only. Group chats aren't supported.
- » Microsoft Teams users and Skype users can't see each other's presence.
- » Searching for learners on Skype by using their Skype ID or phone number isn't supported.

What are the advantages of using Microsoft Teams?


- You can blur the background or use custom backgrounds while on video.
- The Microsoft Teams app is the same for Windows and macOS: if you are a macOS user, you no longer have to worry about missing features, as you will have the same experience as Windows users!
- » If you are borrowing a friend's computer, you can use Microsoft Teams on the web. There's no need to download the app.
- » Microsoft Teams includes AI-powered background noise suppression. This means that there is less background noise when making calls, so there are fewer distractions for trainers and learners.
- » With the current global situation, more companies have adopted Microsoft Teams to communicate internally. This means that it's easier to contact learners!

Can I try Microsoft Teams now?


If you would like to try Microsoft Teams now, it's available to launch from Outlook on the web by selecting **App launcher** in the top left corner:



Then select **Teams** from the sidebar menu that appears:



If Teams isn't currently shown in the Apps area, go to **App launcher > All apps > Teams**:



Can I use Microsoft Teams on the web with my current browser?

Microsoft Teams on the web supports the following browsers:

- » Internet Explorer 11
- » Microsoft Edge
- » The latest version of Chrome
- » The latest version of Firefox




How can I make a test call in Microsoft Teams?

There are two ways to make a test call in Microsoft Teams:


1. Either type /testcall in the search box at the top of the page:




2. Or click on your profile picture in the top right of the screen, then select **Settings**:



From the **Settings** menu, select **Devices** > **Make a test call**:




The test call checks your call and network quality as well as the microphone, speaker, and camera that you have connected:



How do I log out of Microsoft Teams?

To log out of Microsoft Teams, you can either click on your profile picture in the top right corner and select **Sign out** or right click on the app icon in your taskbar and select **Sign out**:




Will we be using Microsoft Teams for group sessions?

Once we have confirmed the viability of Microsoft Teams for Coach sessions, we will explore the possibility of using Microsoft Teams for group sessions.


Where can I find the Microsoft Teams shortcuts?

There are three ways:

1. In the top right corner of Microsoft Teams, click on your profile picture and select **Keyboard** shortcuts:



2. Type /keys into the search box at the top of the Microsoft Teams window:



3. On Windows, press Ctrl + . (full stop). On MacOS, press Cmd (光) + . (full stop):
